School Donation Requests

You would have received the Roseneath School Contribution Request by now. If you have not received one, it will be because there is nothing outstanding—please contact the office if you are concerned. The fee includes a donation to the school, stationery your child received on day 1, subscriptions to Mathletics and Stepsweb, an EOTC component and if your child is in Year 7&8 a Technicraft fee. Also there will be charges for any outside activity that your child has joined through the school eg basketball, After school care. Please note that these outside activity fees are separate to the other contributions and need to be paid. If they are not paid then the school covers this through their yearly budget, meaning that money normally spent on curriculum, for the whole school is reduced.

We rely on school donations to supplement the government funding which with our reduced roll this year is less than we had anticipated. If you are in the position to help out with a donation for someone unable to contribute that would be greatly appreciated. Thank you for supporting our school to be the vibrant, inclusive community that it is!




125th Anniversary

* A Simple Trick for When You Are About to LOSE IT With Your Child:

Take a deep breath... and "trade places."

Think "If I was my child, what kind of parent would I need right now?"

When your child breaks something you've told them to be careful with a million times...

Instead of snapping:

"Look what you did! I told you so many times!"

"Trade places":

You KNOW you made a mistake. You already feel bad.

Be the parent you need:

"I am feeling very frustrated. I know this was an accident. I need a minute to myself before we talk about this."

"Trading places" is like a reset button for your brain.

It helps you see the situation from your child's perspective BEFORE you lose it with your child.

So next time your child does something that could push you over the edge...take a deep breath, "trade places", and be the parent you'd need if your roles were reversed.

Downloading the Skool Loop app - a step by step guide

Once you have downloaded the Skool Loop App, via either your Google Play or App store, please follow the below instructions to select your school -

- Open the Skool Loop App you will land on a welcome page.
- Click the 'Select your schools' this will bring you to a menu you can either search your school
